There were two small craft advisories during the week, so, we would have been limited to the ICW for most of the week had the boat been working. Of course it didnøt slow Jordan from fishing or Suzanne from relaxing at the beach!

Even being off the water for the week there was still much to learn while observing folks that were out and about on the water. For the most part folks were obeying the rules of the road and exercising caution with the chop and stiff winds. However there were some folks who may have benefitted from one or more of the USPS courses. The most common problems observed were not obeying the õno wakeö zone signs and a few folks on the water not skilled at handling their boats in the stiff winds and choppy water. Thankfully the Shallotte Sail and Power Squadron had their posters up at the boat ramps for the ABC-3 safe boating course. I hope folks took notice!

During the fall of 2016 we will offer two classes: the ABC-3 course and Advanced Piloting

Advanced Piloting will be offered on Thursdays, September 1st, 8th, 15th, 22nd, 29th, October 6th, 14th, 20th, and 26th from 7:00 to 9:00 PM at New Hope United Methodist Church at 5125 Shattalon Drive, Winston-Salem NC 27106. Cost for the course is \$70 to cover the cost of the Advanced Piloting Manual, Weekend Navigator, Rose Point Coastal Explorer DVD, plotter, divider, Bowditch Bay and 1210TR training charts, and shipping. The new AP course includes more training on GPS, radar, chart plotters, and autopilots. Please let me know as soon as possible if you would like to take this course. We would like to follow this course with Junior Navigation later in the winter.

The Americas Boating Course ó Third Edition will be taught on Tuesday nights, October 4th, 11th, 18th, 25th, and November 1st from 7:00 until 9:00 PM at the Old Town Recreation Center at 4550 Shattalon Drive, Winston-Salem, NC 27106. The cost for the course is \$55 which includes the course manual, DVD, and a 6 month trial membership in the USPS/WSSPS. Please encourage friends and family to attend this NASBLA approved boating course. The ABC-3 course meets the requirements for those needing a boating license in the state of North Carolina. The ABC-3 classes are also great opportunities to share information on the USPS and Winston-Salem Sail and Power Squadron.
