During the month of September 2022, Americas Boating Club of Winston-Salem/Winston-Salem Sail and Power Squadron offered the Americas Boating Course – 3 at the Polo Park Community Center in Winston-Salem. Two students, Nelson Bryson and Devon Piner, attended and passed the course. Devon had taken the class online a few years ago and wanted to take a class in-person as a refresher. He commented that the discussion and opportunity to ask questions in-person was a significant advantage over the online class. Both students are active boaters and had a opportunity to apply on the weekends what they were learning while taking the class. Congratulation to Nelson and Devon. Both expressed interest in taking more of the ABC/USPS classes and seminars in the near future.

With relatively moderate winters and avid anglers in the Carolinas, boating continues year-round in the area as weather permits. With boaters continue on the water, here are a few safety tips for boating in cooler weather:

Wear your life jacket. Whether warm or cold weather life jackets won't work unless they are worn. Type III vest style life jackets also offer a small degree of warmth if you happen to end up in the water.

File a float plan with someone that you trust to call for help if you are not back or have not responded to them by the time that you said that you would be off the water. You should file a float plan anytime that you go boating!

Dress for the water, not the weather! Dress in multiple layers. Avoid wearing cotton clothing while boating, cotton will not keep you warm when wet and will tend to have a cooling effect. Wool and synthetic clothing are better options. Keep an extra change of clothing onboard in case you do get soaked.

Protect exposed skin from wind chapping and sunburn. You can still get too much sun in the winter and the chill of cold air in a moving boat can result in chapping. Protective clothing and sunscreen are your friends!

Stay hydrated! Monitor your water intake. It is easy to forget that you can become dehydrated on cooler days just as those warmer summer day. You might want to bring along extra food as well, such as energy bars or trail mix.

Keep all batteries charged! This includes boat batteries, cell phone batteries, as well any hand-held VHF radios and other electronic devices. Batteries tend to lose their charge faster in colder temperatures.


Have a dry bag! Store extra clothing, your cell phone, and any other items that you don't want to get wet in a dry bag.

Double check everything. Make a checklist for your boat and your trip. Check and recheck the list as you are preparing to get underway.

Always remember safety first when boating. The Americas Boating Club of Winston-Salem will be offering more classes and seminars in 2023, so watch you emails, the WSSPS website and Facebook page, and the Crossed Anchors. In the Americas Boating Course – 3 we talk about the effects of boating in cold weather, cold water immersions, as well as how to respond to weather related emergencies.
